



Supplier Guidelines for Work and Presence at the ENEC HQ Office Premises during COVID-19 Pandemic

The Emirates Nuclear Energy Corporation (ENEC) and its subsidiary companies Nawah Energy Company (Nawah) and Barakah One Company prioritize the health, safety and welfare of its staff, its suppliers and the wider community above all else.

Following the directives of the Government of Abu Dhabi, ENEC has put in place the below mandatory measures and controls to ensure the safety of all personnel and to maintain a healthy work environment at its headquarters located in the IRENA Building, Masdar City, Abu Dhabi.

The below requirements are applicable to all visitors, contractors, and delivery operators of the supplier's organization. It is expected that the below requirements are communicated to the concerned staff and followed by all suppliers during their presence in any ENEC premise.

- **Access and Visits into ENEC Premises during COVID-19 :**
 - Access to all ENEC premises will be limited to the minimum number of people essential to deliver the work and agreed levels of service. Wherever possible, electronic technology should be used to conduct 'virtual meetings', and deliver services remotely where applicable.
 - Should a person require physical access to the premises, they will be required to complete and return a health declaration form before they arrive at any of ENEC's premises. They must also produce their passport on arrival to verify the information on the form. Failure to meet this requirement may result in access being denied to the individual.
 - As advised by the UAE Government, visitors are encouraged to have the latest DoH COVID-19 tracking app (Al Hosn) available on their mobile.
 - All visitors are advised to use private transportation and avoid public transportation as much as possible when scheduling visits to ENEC's premises.

- **Control Measures during COVID-19:**
 - All visitors, contractors, and delivery operators entering ENEC premises will, without exception, be required to pass through sanitization tunnels. The liquid used in the tunnel is guaranteed to be non-irritant and is completely harmless to the people passing through.
 - All visitors, contractors, and delivery operators entering ENEC premises will, without exception, be required to pass by the thermal camera monitoring stations. In the event of a reading above the allowable temperature, the person concerned will be asked to step aside, wait for a few



minutes, and pass through the thermal camera again. If the temperature is still above the allowable level, the person concerned will be asked to leave the building and obtain the necessary medical advice, and inform their relevant line manager and/or ENEC Enterprise focal point.

- While on ENEC premises the visitor will be expected to comply with the rules in place, maintain social distancing of 2 meters, and relevant hygiene routines as stipulated by the Ministry of Health.

- **Testing, Self-Monitoring and PPE:**

- All contractors, visitors and delivery personnel entering ENEC premises will be required to monitor their own health and make sure they are fit. PPE such as gloves and facemasks are available and must be worn at all times and as directed while inside the premises.
- Everyone entering the building must follow the guidelines relating to personal hygiene, respiratory hygiene and cough etiquette at all times.
- Physical contact with people must be avoided at all occasions.
- People in shared accommodation must practice social distancing with household members during COVID-19 isolation / quarantine as per DoH guidelines.

- **Suspected and Confirmed Cases:**

- If a contractor, visitor or delivery personnel member develops COVID-19/Flu-like symptoms, they must not come to ENEC premises and ensure to contact a medical center and inform their relevant line manager and/or ENEC focal point.

- **Material Deliveries:**

All suppliers delivering goods to any of ENEC's premises must have a 'COVID-19 Prevention Plan' that is aligned with the Government of Abu Dhabi Directives:

1. Material and equipment deliveries must be kept to a minimum, and managed in a planned way, to minimize the exposure to personnel.
2. All delivery operators must follow the entry procedures and comply with directives on hygiene, social distancing and PPE. If required new gloves and masks will be provided upon entrance to avoid cross contamination.
3. Ensure that delivery personnel comply with agreed PPE requirements, and only access the agreed location via the agreed route.
